

President Christy Bussey called the meeting to order.

Cathy Hite, Secretary, pronounced a quorum.

Revised Minutes of the May 18, 2023 board meeting were discussed, reviewed and stand approved as distributed.

President's Report:

Christy thanked the Preservation Club for a successful Boat Rally despite the

Treasurers Report:

• Randy Graves, Treasurer made a motion to certify the bills paid for the month ending May 2023. The second was made by Seleta Davis. The motion passed unanimously.

Committee Reports:

Community Relations Committee:

Kristina Coolidge Committee Chair reported the committee did not meet this month. A Shareholder Survey will be sent out to shareholders within the next couple of weeks. It is important for shareholders to respond to the survey as the results help drive the Strategic Plan goals annually. She requested anyone with photos from the Boat Rally to send those to her or office staff for inclusion in the Chatter.

Natural Resources Committee:

Seleta Davis Committee Chair reported the committee met during the preboard meeting on Monday, June12th. Matt, our biologist from Lochow attended and provided the entire board with an update on the lake vegetation. The year began with 600 grass carp introduced. Starting in early April, Matt began spraying for emergent vegetation. Matt has traveled parts of the lake in order to assess the current conditions and apply herbicides for submersed vegetation with some emergent herbicide. Current assessment is we are significantly better than last year. Matt is observing hydrilla in upper coves. His assessment shows expansion of vegetation that Grass Carp DO NOT eat and less in the vegetation that the Grass carp DO eat. Therefore, Grass Carp are beginning to do their job. In September, Matt will make a determination on the amount of grass carp to be introduced in 2024. When asked if CWC should provide herbicides for shareholder spraving. Matt stated for it to be truly beneficial, it would require multiple, consistent spraving therefore he doesn't believe it would be beneficial at this time.

Facilities and Amenities Committee:

Thomas Merritt Committee Chair reported the committee did meet on June 8th. The committee is discussing getting bids / proposals to address the drainage and roof improvements needed for the CWC office (NK20). The committee met with Enterprise regarding the CWC vehicle leases. The consensus is that renewing the leases with Enterprise is the most prudent option at this time. The committee / staff will discuss next steps.

Rules and Policies Committee:

Paul Oberthier provided report for Rhonda Bullard, Committee Chair.

Variance Requests

The committee had 1 variance request for consideration this month.

1. SJ51 – build a new home 24' from the road and 73' from the shoreline.

Paul Oberthier moved to approve the variance. A second was made by Randy Graves. The motion passed unanimously.

With no other business, President Christy Bussey adjourned the meeting at 6:25 pm.

Common Sense and boater safety go hand in hand.

One of the most important parts of boating safety is to use your common sense. Things such as operating your vessel at a safe speed at all times, staying alert at all times not only of what is going on inside your boat but what is happening outside of it, this includes other watercraft, people, objects, etc. It's also important to be aware of buoys and other navigational aids, all

Use a Spotter

An important safety tip everyone should follow when they're water tubing is to use a spotter. As the driver of a boat, you aren't able to watch your riders and drive the boat safely at the same time. With the help of a spotter, you will know if your rider has fallen off the tube or if the tow rope breaks, and you will be able to focus on safely maneuvering the boat in the water.

Drive Responsibly

When you pull a tube behind your boat, you are responsible for the safety of the rider on the tube. You should maintain a reasonable speed to prevent accidents, and steer clear of another boat's wake. It is also important to be aware of other boats and obstacles in the water as you drive, and before you start moving, double check that your rider is in position and ready to go.

Here are a few reminders of the CWC's Rules & Regulations regarding boating.

No boat, jet ski, personal watercraft, or water bike shall be operated at a speed in excess of forty (40) mph on open or ski waters during daylight hours and thirty (30) mph during nighttime hours thirty (30) minutes after sunset to thirty (30) minutes before sunrise; thirty (30) mph upon named boat roads; ten (10) mph upon access boat roads and idle speed upon all other areas of the lake unless otherwise posted When meeting an oncoming watercraft on a boat road, operators must reduce their watercraft speed to headway speed (idle speed, no wake speed) from the point the two watercrafts are within fifty feet of one another, until the two watercrafts' sterns have passed each other.





We will be having a catfish seminar on July 22, 2023. Please bring your poles and we will show you how to tie different hooks and use several different baits. We will also so y'all how to clean your catfish. Please call me at 903-738-2444 to let me know you are coming.

Our program for June was by Brittany Chesser who is an Aquatic Vegetation Management Specialist and Lead Diagnostic Scientist at Texas A & M.

Prior to the meeting, John Coward, Brittany and Bo obtained several samples of both emerged and submerged vegetation. Of all the vegetation, there were 3 samples that could cause issues in our lake.

1. Bladderwort is a light green plant that is or can be 4 feet tall or taller. Because it is segmented, it can separate very easily by manual harvest and each segment contains small seeds and can regrow. The best herbicide available is only rated as "good" and may require multiple applications to help kill the plant. If herbicide is used, several precautions must be taken. If the herbicide is used neighbors need to be advised of the application and should not water their yard or garden for 3 days. The herbicide is Diquat brand name or Tsunami-D. Label instructions must be followed.

- 2. Coontail is a darker green plant that grows just below the surface. The herbicide to use is Chelated Copper Sulfate and a non-ionic surfactant can bae used but is not necessary.
- 3. Water Milfoil is in vast quantities above Silvey Bridge. The herbicide that can kill Water Milfoil must be applied by a person who possesses a Texas Permit. Water Milfoil will not be eaten by Triploid Grass Carp and Coontail would be one of the last choices for the Grass Carp. Bladderwort can be eaten by Grass Carp. Bladderwort can be eaten by Grass Carp, when they are large enough to make a good impact on the plant.

Shortly, I will try to find photos of all the plants we were able to sample.

Copper Sulfate or Blue stone is only good for algae that may appear in July or August.

For emerged vegetation, shareholders can use Rodeo or Round Up Custom. The regular Round up should not be used in any portion of Lake Cherokee.


