General Rules & Regulations, VI. Prohibited Watercraft Equipment Current Rule:

No motors with open exhaust will be allowed to operate on Lake Cherokee No sirens except by Lake

Cherokee Patrolmen and law enforcement personnel on duty.

Proposed Rule Change, First Reading: No motors with open exhaust will be allowed to operate on Lake Cherokee. (no changes) Mud boat motor (surface drive or longtail motors) exhaust systems must be muffled using factory or factory offered equivalent muffler (BPS Q). Modifications that bypass or reduce the muffler's effectiveness are prohibited.

No sirens except by Lake Cherokee Patrolmen and law enforcement personnel on duty. (re-numbered only)

Rationale: To manage the noise and disruption that can result from these types of boats.

Natural Resources Committee Meeting Dee Rea, Chairman presented the following

Dee Rea, Chairman presented the following report from the committee:

We began our discussions with areas around the Lake that would benefit from underbrush clearing. Our thoughts are that this is necessary to reduce wildfire dangers and to encourage timber growth. Plus, it may create a more esthetic appearance. The Dog Wood Circle area has been completed, and we think it looks great. Thank you, Kevin. Committee Members listed other areas that would benefit from this type of management:

Veterans Walking Trail on the north side Arrowhead Park on the south side and areas in the SC and SB sections Possible trimming of trees and underbrush on the 2 lots Cherokee Water Co. owns in the Beaver Run Road in the NT section.

We also talked about items to protect our most valuable natural resource, WATER. We had conversations about requiring contractors to provide proof of: General Liability Insurance



Pollution Liability/ Environmental Insurance Jones Act/ Maritime Employers Liability Insurance Environmental/Hazmat and Retrieval Coverage

There was thought that with the increased use of hydraulic equipment to build on the Lake and maintain the Lake, contractors should be prepared to handle an accidental spillage of fluids. (They are all toxic) Contractors should have an Oil Spill Response Kit on site at all times including absorbent booms and pads. Contractors should be fully responsible for spill containment, cleanup and restoration. These suggestions will be given to Kevin for consideration. A discussion was had concerning the next siltation removal site in Mud Creek. The design and construction of the siltation pond was discussed. Again, this information and suggestions will be presented to the full Board of Directors .



Growing Fish Fast - Supplemental Feeding

Introduction

Supplemental feeding programs for fish are commonly used in aquaculture and lake management to improve the growth rates of specific species, increase fish production per acre, attract fish to targeted fishing areas, and provide downstream benefits such as increased egg production from forage fish due to improved health. However, while fish trained to a feeder will often consume anything that hits the water, there is a science to designing an effective feeding program. In this article, we will discuss how to maximize the cost-to-benefit ratio of feeding fish and the different feed requirements for each species.

Starting a Feeding Program

Although fish are not typically considered highly intelligent, many species will quickly adapt to eating prepared feed. The key to successfully getting fish onto a prepared diet is consistency, feed quality, and understanding your target species. Not all fish readily accept artificial feed-species like bass and crappie, for instance, may never feed consistently. This is why most feeding programs in lake management, even those aimed at producing trophy bass, focus primarily on forage fish rather than sportfish.

Species such as bluegill, catfish, carp, and other omnivores are far more likely to respond positively to a structured feeding schedule. A consistent feeding regime is crucial—sporadic hand-feeding every few days or weeks is unlikely to train fish to rely on artificial feed. While you may see occasional interest from passing fish, establishing a routine where hundreds of fish actively feed at the surface requires a process of

Training fish to feed in a specific area takes time. Throwing out feed at the same times each day, or using an automatic feeder one to two times daily, will help attract and keep fish around the feeding zone. This not only boosts the health and size of forage fish but also improves sportfishing. The daily commotion of feeding can draw in predators like bass and crappie, creating a hotspot for anglers.

Even for those who aren't interested in fishing, watching hundreds or even thousands of fish aggressively feed at the surface can be an entertaining experience, especially for kids and nature lovers. Just remember: reaching this level of activity can take several weeks. Consistency—feeding at the same times every day—is the key to

Choosing the Right Feed

The next step in improving fish growth and attraction is choosing the right feed for your target species. A common misconception is that all fish feed is the same, and that if the fish eat it, they will grow. This is simply not true. Like any animal, different fish species have unique dietary requirements for optimal health and growth.

For example, bluegill require significantly more protein than catfish. Bluegill feed should contain 40-45% protein, with juvenile bluegill needing even more. In contrast, catfish only require 28–32% protein to grow efficiently. So, if you're feeding low-protein catfish food to try to grow larger bluegill, your results will fall short.

While high-protein feed is more expensive per bag, fish that require high-protein diets are typically more efficient at converting feed into body mass. This means that despite the higher cost per bag, the cost per pound of fish growth is often lower. Additionally, higher-quality feeds tend to be more palatable, reducing waste and improving feeding efficiency.

To get the best results, always select feed tailored to the species you are trying to

When to Stop Feeding

Feeding fish is generally beneficial for promoting growth and attracting fish to your dock, but there are times when feeding can become harmful. In winter, when water temperatures approach or drop below 55°F, fish metabolism slows significantly. If fish consume feed during this time, it may not digest properly, leading to internal rot, infection, or death.

Although fish typically stop feeding at the surface during cold months, it's best to stop your feeding program in late November to early December and resume in March. This precaution helps prevent accidental losses and supports long-term fish health.

TEXAS WATER SAFETY ACT

All shareholders are responsible for abiding by the current provisions of the Texas Water Safety Act



AUTHORIZED WATERCRAFT



- Lot Number required on ALL BOATS, PERSONAL WATERCRAFT
 - Only boats, personal watercraft and other water vessels registered in the name of the shareholder or shareholder's spouse with registered address matching CWC records

PROHIBITED BOATS ON LAKE CHEROKEE

- Boats > 28 feet in length
- Houseboats
- · Boats with permanent sleeping facilities
- Boats with sanitation facilities
- Amphibious aircraft
- · Airboats or swamp boats
- No motors with open exhaust



OPERATION OF WATERCRAFT




Privilege card holder must be born before Sept 1, 1993 unless operator is 13 years of age or older and has passed a boaters education course; or is accompanied by a person at least 18 years of age and can lawfully operate the watercraft

SPEED LIMITS & BOAT SAFETY

- Not above idle speed within 50 ft of any vessel, person, shore or stationary object
- NO speed in excess of 40 mph in open or ski waters (day) or 30 mph (night)
- 30 mph in named boat roads
- 10 mph access boat roads



WAKE BOATS



WATER SKIING

- Restricted to open water marked by buoys and no closer than 150 ft from piers and boathouses.
- Any boat pulling water skis require a min. of 2 people in the boat so that driver can keep proper lookout.
- All skiers are required to wear approved flotation device.
- PWC can not pull a person or persons on water skis, surfboard or similar devices.



PROHIBITED BOATING AND FISHING AREAS



- No closer than 100 ft to carp fence
- No boating in the SWEPCO canal or City of Longview water intake area
- No tying boats to buoys

SWIMMING

- Only Privilege Card Holders and guests are allowed to swim in Lake Cherokee
- Prohibited from the spillway to Section NB, from the dam, SWEPCO canal, boat roads and City of Longview intake area or CWC office piers
- Limited to 100 ft from shore, pier, or boathouse




