

End of Year Summary

Introduction

The 2025 season marked the second year in a row of dramatic improvement across the board for Lake Cherokee. Our goals for the year remained the same as in 2024, which were to target invasive species of aquatic vegetation and control all species that hinder lake access in boat lanes and in front of boat houses. The goal for the fishery was also the same; continue to work on fish harvest to improve health of sportfish and populations of forage fish.

Herbicides and Vegetation Management

As mentioned previously, aquatic vegetation management remains a primary annual goal of ours. Our focus is on eradicating invasive species such as hydrilla, eurasian milfoil, and water hyacinth and promoting the establishment of native species like coontail and fanwort. The reason we do this is because invasive species grow faster, are typically more difficult to control, and have negative effects on the ecosystem. This year was the second consecutive year in a row where hydrilla was not seen on the lake at any density. Instead coontail, a native and beneficial species to both fish and wildlife, has remained the predominant submerged species. (High water levels and increased turbidity associated with rainfall have both contributed to a reduction in submerged vegetation overall in 2024 and 2025).

We are also still utilizing various herbicide combinations depending on species, location, water quality conditions, duration of control, etc. to ensure that we provide the most effective, cost effective, and environmentally safe approach. No copper algaecides or herbicides were used again this year which has continued to create noticeable improvements on muck break down and filamentous algae growth. We intend to further utilize different tools in 2026 to reduce muck and enhance beneficial bacteria so that we can address the root cause of plant growth issues and begin reversing the aging process of the lake. This creates a healthier, higher functioning ecosystem that over time can require less herbicide usage, increases in water depth, and improved water quality.

Overall vegetative coverage has decreased some from 2024, primarily in high problem areas such as Lees Creek, several small coves, and behind Silvy bridge. The rest of the lake maintained similar densities of aquatic vegetation like the end of 2024. But, this is intentional, as we try our best to balance wildlife and fisheries with recreation. Currently, aquatic vegetation sits in the ideal coverage range of 5-9% total surface area (a slight drop from 8-12% last year). We plan to continue to optimize our management going forward and make improvements each year.

End of Year Fish Data

Our end of year fish survey for 2025 showed continued improvement from 2023 and 2024 despite missing some harvest opportunities with the bass tournament and day to day anglers (anticipate some stalling or regression next year due to lower annual harvest this year). Fish data after two years of new management:

1. Bass relative weights (a measure of overall health) have increased from 87% in 2023 to 92% in 2024, and now 97.1% in 2025.
2. Crappie relative weights also increased from 88% in 2023 to 89% in 2024, and now 91.5% in 2025. This year we saw a bigger improvement in crappie overall which is likely correlated with higher harvest rates this year than in 2023-2024.
3. Forage fish populations for gizzard shad, threadfin shad, and bluegill are similar to 2024 with continued improvements of larger forage noted during the survey from 2023 and 2024.
4. Redear sunfish populations once again increased dramatically from 2024 to now indicating that fish harvest is slowly leading to improvements in the food chain.

Another very exciting note from our final fall survey of 2025 is that smaller bass 8-11 inches long appeared to be performing exceptionally well overall. This is great news because these fish are the ones with trophy potential and are the future of the lake. As long as our combined harvest efforts with fishermen and our electrofishing surveys continue year over year, the future is bright for the fishing on Lake Cherokee and the recent findings in young fish support this. (Three young bass 10.5-11.75 inches in total length had a combined average relative weight of 117% percent in our fall survey)

Our goal is to create the greatest private lake in the country and meet the needs of each and every stakeholder that calls Lake Cherokee home. These first two years have been exciting and full of improvement. We look forward to continuing to make Lake Cherokee better in 2026 with innovative, total lake management approaches. - Change the oil and oil filters
- Change the lubricant in engine transmission or the outboard lower unit
- Apply fogging if called for by manufacturer
- Drain the boat's fuel tanks as much as possible
- Fill the boat's fuel tanks completely full
- Add biocide and/or stabilizing agents to fuel
- Change the fuel filters
- Add antifreeze to the engine's cooling system
- Add distilled water to batteries, charge completely and disconnect
- Charge batteries to capacity

NOTE: Size limits for bass have been updated in 2026. The new bag limits chart can be found in this edition of The Chatter. You are encouraged to KEEP all bass between 10 and 18 inches. This is to reduce the overpopulation of fish in this range and encourage the remainder to put on a little weight! Lake Cherokee uses a "harvest slot" rather than a "protective slot" approach. Protective slots are common to many Texas lakes, but the harvest slot is better

suited to Lake Cherokee's fisheries management. Check out the graph which shows a high number of largemouth bass in this range, and the graph illustrating most falling below the line in expected weight.

The club works closely with Lake Biologist, Garrett Stamp of Pristine Pond Solutions to promote appropriate strategies for a healthy fish population.




CFC BASS TOURNAMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

Registrant or One Team Member must have 2026 CFC Membership

A. General Rules

1. All Texas rules of the Texas Water Safety Act will apply to all tournaments. The CFC Lake Patrol will enforce the CFC Rules, TP&W Rules and Regulations, and Texas Water Safety Act.
2. Each boater must wear a USCG-approved life vest any time the main motor is started or running. Inflatable life vests are permitted, provided they are worn at all times.
3. No alcohol or drugs are allowed while fishing in the tournament. Violations will result in disqualification.
4. Any person found to be cheating or endangering watercraft, its occupants, or the property of others will be disqualified and may be banned from all Cherokee Fishing Club events.
5. All weigh-in results of the Tournament Scale are official. Any protests must be brought to the attention of the Tournament Director at the time of weigh-in. The Tournament Director's decision will be final.
6. All participants must display good sportsmanship. Unsportsmanlike conduct, including cheating, harassment, or verbal/physical interference with tournament weigh-in or with other participants, will result in disqualification.
7. No Fishing is allowed within 100 yards of the tournament weigh-in location.
8. Fishermen must be in the Weigh-In line no later than the designated time of the end of the tournament.
9. The Cherokee Fishing Club does not provide tournament weigh-in bags and all fish must be placed in a tournament bag, with sufficient water to keep the fish alive during the weigh-in process.

10. Entry fees will not be refunded unless the tournament is canceled or postponed by the CFC President or CFC Tournament Director.

11. Participants may fish from the bank, a dock, a boat, canoes, kayaks, rubber rafts, and float tubes.

B. Bass Tournament – Black, Spotted, Florida, or any combination thereof.

1. Entry Fee is \$50.00 for a boat/2-member team or a single lone fisherman. The team sponsoring shareholder or one person in the boat must be a current paid-up CFC member. No more than two people per boat.
2. Start time is 6:30 a.m., and Weigh-in time is 3:00 p.m. Participants may weigh in any time after 1:00 p.m. until the final weigh-in time. Late arrivals will not be allowed to weigh in.
3. Bag limit: five (5) live fish per boat. Fish must be a minimum of fourteen (14)" or greater in length. No dead fish will be weighed in.
4. Winning places to be paid will be determined by the Tournament Director and, in the absence of the Tournament Director, an officer of the CFC.
5. Prizes will be awarded based on team results on the heavy stringer. The Tournament Director may have individual prizes based on the heaviest Bass and additional levels of the heaviest Bass.
6. All weigh-in results of the Tournament Scale are official. Any protests must be brought to the attention of the Tournament Director during weigh-in. The Tournament Director's decision will be final.

Generally, Fishermen may not retain any Bass brought to weigh in. All Bass brought to weigh-in will be released back into the lake unless the Tournament Director elects a Harvesting option.
